## ODU 1982

The 1982 Lady Monarchs won their first seven games of the season, posting an aggregate score of 27-4 with three shutouts. A 2-1 loss to Temple halted the run, but ODU won their next 10 games to complete a 17-1 regular season that included three wins over the tournament field. The top seed in the tournament, ODU won their first title in school history behind Honda honoree Yogi Hightower and fellow All-Americans Diane Bracalente and Christy Morgan by winning three consecutive one-goal games, culminating with a 3-2 victory over the previous champion Huskies.

## IOWA 1986

19-2-1 • NCAA Champions

The 1986 Hawkeyes opened with three shutouts in a four-win streak to start the season, and then a loss and a tie in their next two games brought their record to 4-1-1. They answered with six consecutive shutouts and a streak that lasted almost 450 minutes. Iowa added two more wins to move to 12-1-1. A loss to Northeastern halted the streak, but for more wins closed out the regular season and the Hawkeyes had put together a 16-2-1 regular season that included a 9-1 slate in the Big 10 that earned them the regular season title, beating four teams headed to the tournament. Behind All-Americans Karen Napolitano, RosAnna Salcido, Michelle Murgatroyd, Deb Robertson and Liz Tchou, Iowa earned a bye in the first round and faced rival Northeastern in the quarterfinals for the third time that season. A victory over Penn State in the semis put Iowa in their first title game in school history, and the next day the Hawkeyes claimed their first title with a gutsy overtime victory over New Hampshire in double overtime.
