

# DIVISION I FIELD HOCKEY ALL TIME CHAMPIONSHIP BRACKET EAST REGIONAL – SECOND ROUND

The 2009 Tar Heels opened with a pair of wins in the opening weekend, and a 4-1 win over Wake Forest started a streak of 58 consecutive goals that included a conference record 690:45 shutout streak that included nine consecutive shutouts. A loss to Maryland halted a 15-game winning streak, and a loss to Virginia in the ACC tournament sent the Heels to the NCAA tournament as the #2 seed. Led by Olympian Jackie Kintzer in the cage, UNC allowed only .68 goals per game that season. Offensively, the Tar Heels were led by All-Americans Katelyn Falgowski, Kelsey Kolojejchick, Ilse Davids and Danielle Forword. They beat the top-seeded and previously undefeated Terrapins in the final, scoring twice in the final five minutes after Karen Shelton pulled Kintzer in favor of an extra field player.

## WAKE 2002

The 2002 Demon Deacons started 1-2, but that one win was over Michigan, who would be seeded #4 in NCAAs. They then won the next 13 games, including six by shutout and four over teams bound for the national tournament. Into ACCs as the top seed, Wake won a pair of games and entered NCAAs at 16-2 and as the #2 seed. Going into nationals, they had allowed 15 goals, led by All-Americans Kelly Doton, Kelly Dostal and Heather Aughinbaugh. Wake Forest didn't allow another goal the remainder of the year, becoming only the third team in Division I history to win the title and not give up a goal behind GK Katie Ridd. The Demon Deacons outscored their opponents 15-0 in the tournament, tying a record for scoring margin.
