

# DIVISION I FIELD HOCKEY ALL TIME CHAMPIONSHIP BRACKET NORTH REGIONAL – SECOND ROUND

## ODU 1991

26-0 • NCAA Champions

The 1991 Lady Monarchs became only the second team to win 26 games in a season, and they were also the second team to go through a campaign undefeated and untied at the NCAA Division I level. ODU opened with a shutout, and then notched a pair of victories in which they gave up two goals each. The win over Maryland started a shutout streak that lasted over 690 minutes during which ODU scored 58 consecutive goals before Duke ended the run. That nine-game shutout streak remains the longest in Division I history. After three straight wins in which ODU allowed a goal in each victory, a new streak that reached 572:43 and the second round of the NCAA tournament. In total, ODU gave up only 8 goals in the regular season that included eight wins over NCAA-bound teams (of a field of 12). Behind All-Americans Maaïke Hilbrand, Pam Neiss, Robin Smith and Laura Knorr, the Lady Monarchs set a new margin of victory record for the season, beating teams by 5.19 goals. ODU only gave up two goals in a game twice, and in only four games was the margin one goal.

## v URSINUS 1975

11-3-3 • AIAW Runners-Up

The 1975 Bears posted a 5-1-3 record in the regular season, culminating with a 1-1 tie against archrival West Chester in the final game before the regional tournament. After a 17-0 combined scoreline in the first two games of the regional, Ursinus defeated Lock Haven 3-1, avenging their only loss of the season and putting the Bears in the final and giving them a ticket to the AIAW championship, the first year it was contested. A loss to West Chester gave Ursinus an 8-2-3 record and they were seeded second in the national tournament. The Bears advanced to the final to face West Chester for a third time that season, and the two went through regulation and overtime knotted at 1-1. West Chester claimed the title in strokes.
