The 2003 Sea Gulls opened the season with five consecutive shutouts before conceding a goal to Johns Hopkins in an 8-1 victory. Two more shutouts followed before TCNJ handed Salisbury what would be their only loss of the season a 4-1 defeat. The Sea Gulls answered with a 3-1 win over Rowan before forging a four-game shutout streak to close out the regular season. Two wins in the CAC tournament moved Salisbury into the NCAA tournament as the #2 seed, where they outscored their opponents 11-2 to win the title. In the final, they became the first team to beat Middlebury that season, handing the Panthers a 1-4 loss. Lindsey Elliott and Melissa Webster earned All-American honors.

The 1988 Lions opened up with five consecutive wins in which they outscored their opponents 14-1. After conceding an early goal in their next game, TSC launched into one of the longest shutout streaks in history, holding their opponents for over 700 minutes while scoring 36 consecutive goals, posting nine consecutive shutouts. Behind All-Americans Suzanne Gallo, Chris Heddy, Holly Trumpovicz and Cheryl Simonsen, the 1988 Lions trailed in only one game. TSC allowed a total of six goals over the course of the season, including only four in the regular season, and won the NCAA title without losing a game the entire year. The Lions went 4-0-2 against tournament teams. Only once did TSC allow more than one goal in a game – in the double-overtime win over Bloomsburg in the title contest.
