The 1998 Royals opened up with five consecutive shutouts and never looked back, scoring 28 consecutive goals. EMU continued its torrid pace, winning the Sea Gull Invite with an overtime victory over Salisbury to push their record to 8-0. Over the next six games, the Royals went 6-0 with three shutouts and an aggregate score of 25-3. EMU closed out the regular season with six more wins, five by shutout, while scoring 54-1 and a record of 20-0. In the ODAC tournament, the Royals did not allow a goal, giving them 17 shutouts in their 23 games. They had outscored their opposition 144-9. Tabbed as the #1 overall seed, the Royals lost their first and only game of the season to Hartwick, 1-0, in the first round. Kirsten Brubaker and Laura Hess were named All-Americans.

v URSINUS 2006

The 2006 Bears split the opening two games, before a 3-2 double overtime victory over Rowan started a three-game shutout streak in which they outscored opponents 19-0. A 2-1 loss at TCNJ was followed by a seven-game streak in which the Bears posted four shutouts. A 2-3 overtime loss to Middlebury put Ursinus at 12-3. From there, the Bears rattled off nine straight wins to claim the title. Ursinus won both games in the Centennial tournament by shutout. A 7-0 win over Kenyon in the NCAA tournament kept the streak alive, and in the quarterfinals Ursinus upset top seed Cortland 2-1 in double overtime on the road, sending the Bears to the semifinals. A 3-2 win over Lehigh Valley moved Ursinus into the final against Messiah, who had defeated the Bears 7-3 in the second game of the season. Ursinus exacted revenge in the final, beating the Falcons 3-2. Kait Sutherland, Allison Douthett, and Jess Lamina earned All-American honors.
